Strategies and approaches to the interpretation of notation in musical performance.

Formats and submissions

Individual presentation:

20 min paper & 5 min discussion

- Abstract (max. 2000 characters incl. spaces)
- Biography (max. 1000 characters incl. spaces)

Panel: 60 min, 90 min or 120 min

To be submitted by the chair of the panel:

- Synoptic outline, including titles of all contributions and a timetable (max. 2000 characters incl. spaces)
- Biography (max. 1000 characters incl. spaces)

To be submitted separately by the participants:

- Abstract with reference to the panel title (max. 2000 characters incl. spaces)
- Biography (max. 1000 characters incl. spaces)

Workshop: 60 min, 90 min or 120 min

- Abstract and synoptic outline (max. 2000 characters incl. spaces)
- Biography (max. 1000 characters incl. spaces)

Book presentations:

Poster session

- Abstract (max. 2000 characters incl. spaces)
- Biography (max. 1000 characters incl. spaces)

All submissions will be double-blind peer-reviewed. They must be ANONYMISED: There must not be any names, addresses or other references to the author in the abstract.
